"With the new Outlook, Microsoft is replacing the Calendar, Contacts, and Mail apps in Windows 10 and Windows 11 as well as in macOS. Although Outlook is new, it will not replace the classic Outlook from the Office package in the near future. The initial aim is to replace the classic UWP (Universal Windows Platform) apps Contacts, Mail, and Calendar in Windows 10 and Windows 11. These three apps will therefore be removed from Windows and merged in Windows 10/11. The new Outlook synchronises all email accounts in Outlook with Microsoft servers. Comments from Ross--Wi-Fi Signal Strength: We use our home wi-fi to get internet access on our laptops, desktop computers, tablets, TVs and cell phones but we don't pay much attention to signal strength. It is important that our modem is placed in an optimal location for the greatest coverage throughout the house. The best place for the modem to be is centrally located in your house if possible, and the higher you can place the modem in the room, the better. Think of wi-fi signals as being broadcast in an umbrella shape, that is, signals will radiate from your modem in a broad downward slope as if you held up an umbrella and the rain water cascades off to the sides. If your modem is on the floor or behind a bookcase, then the wifi signal won't be very strong. However if you mount the modem high up on that same bookcase, you will enjoy a much stronger signal and that signal will go farther distances within your house.
