1. Where were you born and where have you lived?

I was born in St. Paul, Minnesota. I went to the University of Minnesota and received a Math Degree in Education in 1953. I got my first job in White Bear Lake, Minnesota teaching all levels of Math. My next teaching job was in Sterling, Colorado. Later, I applied for a job with GE in Cincinnati, Ohio in the Nuclear Propulsion Department. My next step was a job working for Lockheed in Burbank, California in the Aerospace department. I met my husband Bob through a computer dating service in 1974. I moved with him to Hermosa Beach and went back to teaching. I taught at El Camino Junior College, teaching introduction to Computers.

2. How long have you lived in Windsor?

We moved to a beautiful four acre farm in Windsor to raise our family in 1980. I got a job at Sonoma State as a Computer lecturer and was teaching an Introductory to Computers class. I worked there until I retired in 1996.

3. How long have you been coming to the Windsor Senior Center and what do you like to do here?

I am the creator of the Computer Users group here at the center. The Computer Users group originally started when a bunch of people who wanted to get together and learn more about computers. It was held in a single classroom because the Senior Center didn't exist yet. Once the Senior Center was built we started hosting the meetings here; it was very small only 6 to 8 people. Over the last twenty years this small group grew to include computer classes, guest speakers and now has a drop-in format where seniors can have questions answered for free. *Donna has been a volunteer at the Windsor Senior Center for over 20 years*



4. What would you say you know now about living a happy and successful life that you didn't know when you were twenty?

One thing is the only person you can change is yourself. You can't change anyone else. Don't look in the past and try to correct it. Those things are over; learn from them but you can't go back and change them. Wake up in the morning, say "yes! we made it another day!"
