protected-with-windowssecurity **Comments from Ross--Microsoft Security Center:** For those of you who don't subscribe to Norton, McAfee or other antivirus program, then this article is something to be aware of. The built-in anti-virus software in Windows 10 and 11 is represented by a white "shield" in the lower right-hand corner of your screen and looks like



this: Note the green checkmark—this is what you always want to see. If it has a yellow or red mark on it, then Windows is telling you it needs attention. Simply click once on the icon to open the Security Center that looks like this:
