Advertisers are great at knowing which products I'm interested in, but they never know when I've actually purchased a product. Your best bet is to opt out of

Comments from Ross-- The Power Button: When I help clients remotely, i.e. not physically there, and I ask them to turn off their computer/laptop and then back on, I often told that their computer came back on immediately. I know they didn't actually turn the computer off. What happens when you press the power button once when it is already on just merely puts it into sleep mode. If the computer screen is frozen, the client presses the power button once, and then presses it again, and the screen comes back on in the exact same state it was before. When you want to turn off the computer completely, press and HOLD the power button down for 10 seconds. After 10 seconds the computer shuts completely down. Then you can press the power button once to turn it back on. Use this method if you get a warning window telling you the computer has been compromised and to call a bogus "help" telephone line. **DON'T CALL!** Use the above method to turn the computer off then back on. Chances are good that the bogus scam window will be gone. Also, do not use this method to shut off the computer at the end of the day. Use the Start button from within Windows to shutdown correctly.
