Microsoft ...has found that people who are working from home have three peak periods during a day that does not correspond to the usual 9am to 5pm work day of pre-pandemic times. The company's data suggests that 9-to-5 is over and that meetings outside of previous norms are now common, creating a third peak of activity at night for some. Microsoft researchers call it the 'triple peak day'. Microsoft found that 30 percent of its employees worked more at night based on 'keyboard events'. (cont)

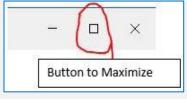

It turns out that in both cases, the user was not viewing their web browser in full screen mode and the SEND button was hidden from view off screen. The solution was to MAXIMIZE the browser window and viola! the SEND button appeared. ButtonTo maximize the browser window is in the upper right corner:
