d) play is the difference between the brightest white and darkest black it can produce, which sounds like contrast ratio, but HDR also includes a wider range of colors, and more nuance in the transition between those colors. In practice, this allows HDR displays to show you a bright sun in a scene, while the shadows it casts remain dark and full of internal detail."
