

- c) by Alaina Yee, 08.22.2023. "Ads are an especially irritating part of web browsing—everyone wants to track your browsing habits just to sell you things. But now preserving your anonymity is becoming a little easier, thanks to a new set of Google Chrome settings that gives more control over targeted ads. It's called Ad Privacy, and you'll need to dig into these settings to keep Google from using or sharing your browsing history for ad purposes. Ad Privacy hasn't reached all Chrome users yet.
- c) When these settings become available, Chrome will display an overlay notification that lets you jump to them. Chrome's new Ad Privacy settings only affect browsing on your PC—it won't affect ad settings for your Google account or on mobile.
